Regional Advisor–Elect

SAACURH selected a new Regional Advisor, who will begin a two year term at the end of NACURH 2012. Thanks so much to Alicia Vest from Appalachian State, our current Regional Advisor, for your service to the region. The NCCs have selected Donna Gabbard from the University of Kentucky as the Regional Advisor–Elect.

Congratulations Donna! We look forward to working with you over the next several years.



Legislative Summary

This year, the NCCs passed fourteen pieces of legislation in the SAACURH Boardroom! We made several major changes to the region, and we want everyone to be aware of what the NCCs voted on.

MMAAA

The NRHH Parliamentarian position was established as an ex-officio member of the SEC, just as the Regional Parliamentarian. Vote: 54–0–0

MMAAB

SAACURH adopted a new award that NACURH established, the Outstanding Advocacy Initiative. This award will recognize RHAs and NRHHs who have taken steps to advocate for change on their campus. Vote: 53–1–0

Legislative Summary, cont.

MMAAC

For last year, the Vanguard savings account was inaccessible due to the passing of the National Advisor. At the time, SAACURH Policy stated that ½ of conference excesses be deposited into the Vanguard. This legislation allowed the SAACURH 2010 and No Frills 2011 conference excesses to be deposited under the new policy, which requires money to be placed in the money market and checking accounts. Vote: 55-0-0

MMAAD

SAACURH withdrew \$15,000 out of the Vanguard account into the money market account. This allows that money to be more easily accessible, and less of SAACURH's assets are in a moderate risk fund. Vote: 55-1-0

MMAAE

SAACURH established a State Director Boardroom in order to alleviate the workload of the NCCs. The new boardroom will be chaired by the RCCDE. This will allow bids to be read more thoroughly in order to select the best bid as the regional winner, and this will create an environment where boardroom can be more efficient at No Frills so we can complete all business. State Directors are now ineligible to serve on the SEC. Vote: 47-2-0

MMAAF

This legislation moved the Distinguished Service Award, the Hallenback Service Award, State Board Member of the Year, Commitment to Diversity Award, and Building RHA Award into the new State Director Boardroom. Vote: 51-0-1

Legislative Summary, cont.

MMAAG

This policy change no longer requires elections to be the first order of business at conferences. This will allow for flexibility with the boardroom agenda, in order for a more efficient boardroom. Vote: Unanimously passed by acclamation

MMAAH

This places SAACURH in alignment with NACURH Policy. All elected SEC members are required to maintain institutional support for their entire term of office, including the transitional period. Vote: 52-1-0

MMAAI

This places into the Policy Book a long standing practice of SAACURH. Conferences will cover the cost of registration for the Regional Parliamentarian and NRHH Parliamentarian. Vote: Unanimously passed by acclamation.

MMAAJ

This legislation gave the authority to conference host schools to select the conference chair and conference advisor. Vote: Unanimously passed by acclamation.

MMAAK

This places SAACURH in alignment with NACURH Policy. When calculating the conference break-even point, SEC and VIP attendees will no longer be included in the breakeven point calculation. Vote: Unanimously passed by acclamation.

Legislative Summary, cont.

MMAAL

This legislation clarifies the duties of the AD–NRHH, placing into the Constitution the responsibilities of working with affiliations, updating the NRHH Policy Book, and deleting duties that have not been in practice for years. Vote: 54–0–0

MMAAM

This legislation moved \$119 into the conference fees line item, which was overspent due to NACURH inviting additional SEC members to NACURH Preconference.

MMAAN

Based on the add–on fee from the SAACURH 2011 Conference and preliminary figures on the conference excess, \$2,000 has been added to the travel line item in order to fund SEC travel to Winter Summit, State Conferences, and National Board Swaps.

NRHH Legislative Summary

MMA

This legislation aligned the SAACURH NRHH Policy Book with the NACURH Policy book regarding OTMs, deleting NCC OTM and redefining or adding Community Service Program, Educational Program, Diversity Program, Passive Program, Social Program, and Faculty/Staff OTMs. Vote: 36–0–0

MMB

This legislation aligned the SAACURH NRHH Policy Book with NACURH's practices in regards to bid submission timelines and procedures for national awards. Vote: 36–0–0

NRHH Legislative Summary, cont.

MMC

This legislation defines the NRHH Parliamentarian as an ex officio member of the SEC, as opposed to a temporary boardroom appointment. Vote: 36-0-0

MMD

This legislation added the criteria into the SAACURH NRHH Policy Book for the newly established Outstanding Advocacy Initiative Award. NRHH Reps will be selecting the regional winner in their boardroom at No Frills. Vote: 36-0-0

Fierce Pierce Award

This award is an honor given to one NCC and one NRHH Representative who made significant contributions during the SAACURH boardroom by mentoring others, providing comments during discussion, and working to further the SAACURH region. The SAACURH 2011 Fierce Pierce Awards go to:

Hey SAACURH!

Thank you all for making this an outstanding year so far! Your SEC has been hard at work all year, and I wanted to take this opportunity to thank Ryan, Megan, Nicole, Beth, Nikki, Alicia, and Adam for their dedication to the region. I couldn't ask for a better team. I have been working on improving communication amongst the SEC and have been holding regular 1:1s in order to help them work towards their individual goals, and to allow them a chance to hold me accountable. I would like to share with you an update of what we've been doing as an SEC, and what I have been doing as Director.

This year, our regional committees are stronger than ever! We really improved our advertising campaign to make sure students around the region were aware of this exciting opportunity, and we received an overwhelming response! The Strategic Planning Committee, which I chair, is currently conducting a SWOT analysis of the region, and will be working on legislation for No Frills.

The SEC has been committed to improving the bid process in order to be more competitive on the national level. I challenged the BID Committee to develop new bid criteria sheets, and we required all award bids to be critiqued by that committee before the final submission deadline. Every school that submitted an award bid made changes and improvements to their bids based off that feedback. I hope to see the fierceness of SAACURH's bids at the national level improve this year!

I have been working with SEAHO, and we are in the process of developing a Statement of Understanding, which will clearly define the relationship between SAACURH and SEAHO. By improving SAACURH's relationship with SEAHO, we have reinstated a \$100 scholarship from SEAHO that will go towards the Student of the Year's registration fee for SAACURH.

Efficiency in the boardroom has been a big priority this year. The NCCs were able to pass a large amount of legislation at SAACURH this year, and we hope that with the addition of the State Director Boardroom and policy changes allowing more flexibility in our agenda, we will have all have a very positive experience at No Frills.

I currently serve as co-chair of the NACURH Corporate Structure Committee, where we are reviewing many of NACURH's practices. As members of the NBD, Ryan and I have been advocating strongly on behalf of the region.

Serving as the SAACURH Regional Director has been an amazing opportunity, and I can't wait to see what the rest of the year has in store! Always feel free to contact me if you ever have any questions.

The SEC is committed to creating programs and services that directly benefit member schools, especially using the dividends earned from the Vanguard investment as it was originally intended to do. The Constitution and Policy Book Review Committee has also been actively engaged this semester in impacting the region through policy changes and education. The committee released the policy guide prior to the SAACURH conference so delegates would have a firm understanding of the governing documents and how legislation works in our region. The committee also assisted in the drafting and presenting of several pieces of legislation for the boardroom at the SAACURH conference.

I am happy to report that SAACURH is current on all reconciliation reports to NACURH and has always come out with a zero balance on these reports. We have also successfully created a savings account for SAAS funds and it has been integrated into the reconciliation report.

I have also been active on the NBD and the Corporate Structure Committee in an effort to represent the fierceness of SAACURH. I have tried to ensure that SAACURH has a presence on the national level through asking questions and working with other NBD members on projects and initiatives.

As part of my responsibility, I have also worked closely with the staffs of our regional conferences. I assisted Georgia State with many budget and logistical issues as related to the conference, and I have been in contact with Valdosta State University regarding No Frills 2012.

In recent times, I have been researching academic recognition programs that are employed in other regions. Nationally, I've been working with other RCCs across the nation to review the regional policy books and offer suggestions to every region on their bid policies.
